School Crossing: GT - Gift or Curse?

The Gifted and Talented road is a long one for parents and educators. What parent doesn't think their child is special? The struggle to keep your student interested and motivated in a classroom where the main focus for teachers, is to move everyone at the same speed. But what about those that have figured out what you're going to say and complete their work before anyone else? Is there more work just to keep them busy? Who is challenging them and do they even want to be challenged? Keep in mind that it's not always about scores and test results. "A sleeping cheetah is still a cheetah."

What does the GT designation really mean for the students themselves? Gift or Curse? I visited with 20 students and parents in the GT program at Wheat Ridge High and the IB program at Lakewood High and asked them about their experiences. When did they first know they were "different"? I'm referring to kids that taught themselves to read at the age of 3. First graders doing 6th grade math. Talented youngsters creating art or music at an adult level.

Jeffco GT Dept Fall Center Application is Available - Deadline Oct. 14

The 2019 GT Fall Center Application is open through Oct. 14 at 4 p.m. This application is for students testing for the 2020-2021 school year. All GT Center testing has been completed for the 2019-2020 school year. There is only ONE application window.

Students who are ONLY seeking GT identification for an Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) and who are planning to remain at their current neighborhood, option, or charter school, and NOT planning to attend a GT Center school should complete this <u>application</u>. The ID process could take several weeks to complete. Parents will be notified via email regarding GT identification and/or the creation of an ALP.

What You Need to Know Before Your Gifted Child Takes the PSAT

Thank you to Ginny Riley for writing "One Day Matters: A Mom's Journey" about her son who was a National Merit Semi-Finalist at Conifer High School. She brings to light how gifted students often score lower each time they take the PSAT, why this happens, and how to keep this from happening to your child. Note, PSAT this year is scheduled in October. Please check with your high school as to when they are offering it.

<u>Center for Bright Kids Western Academic Talent Search (WATS) Testing for</u> <u>Gifted Students in Grades 3-9</u>

The <u>Center for Bright Kids</u> (CBK) is the regional talent center in the Rocky Mountain area, serving 7 states, providing summer programs and other youth programs. The goal of CBK is to "offer K-12 enrichment and acceleration programming for high interest and high ability kids. Our focus is not only on how kids think and learn, but how they discover ways to navigate the world while thinking and learning differently. CBK is focused on providing safe spaces for kids to laugh and play while being intellectually challenged with intensive academic experiences and actively engaged in meaningful, authentic learning experiences."

In addition to their youth programs, CBK also offers testing without ceilings, provided by the Western Academic Talent Search (WATS). The benefit of this testing is to find a child's true potential in Reading, English, Math, and Science at the given time they take the test. Typical assessments used by school districts only test one or two grades up, not demonstrating some childrens' true potential in a subject. WATS testing goes far beyond one or two grades. WATS uses ACT, SAT, and PSAT 8/9 tests. PSAT 8/9 is used for grades 3-6, while ACT and SAT are used for grades 6-9.

Testing runs from October-Feb. If your child has an Advanced Learning Plan (ALP), you will need to contact the Jeffco Gifted & Talented Department to receive the Jeffco GT Eligibility letter for WATS testing. Once they verify a student's GT status, they will send the necessary letter to you electronically. Your child can qualify to test in other ways too if you are interested. If you allow results to be reported to your school district, at least in Jeffco, they will become part of your child's ALP, further aiding your child's teachers in challenging him or her academically.
