JAGC is holding our annual election in May. For voting members, you will receive a ballot by email. Please vote and return your ballot by May 7.



# Apply for Outdoor Lab Scholarships by April 14

The <u>Outdoor Lab Foundation</u> offers students who have served as high school leaders or interns at Outdoor Lab the opportunity to apply for scholarships to further their education. This year, three applicants will be awarded a \$2,000 scholarship. <u>Apply here</u>.

Students must meet all of the following criteria to apply:

 Student has served as a high school leader or an Intern for the Jeffco Outdoor Lab Program, at Windy Peak or Mount Evans, within the past three years, and

> training program, college, or university and plans to begin within 12 months from the deadline.



## Summer Credit Advancement for Grades 10-11 - Application **Opens April 27**

Credit Advancement is for Jeffco students in rising grades 10-11 who are independent learners and want to get ahead in credits. Courses are taught online by licensed Jeffco teachers and are accredited. Students can complete a semester course in just four weeks. The cost is \$165 per class. 
