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# Jeffco Gifted and Talented - Center School Spring Testing - Application Closes January 16th - Last Chance to Test This School Year

Jeffco Gifted Center applications for spring testing for GT Center placement at a GT Center school or an Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) at the neighborhood/home school will be open October 16, 2017 through January 16, 2018. Jeffco offers free testing for applicants who are 5 years of age (or older) by October 1, 2017 and in kindergarten. These children are eligible to apply for the start of the 2018-19 school year. 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## Jeffco Early Access Testing for Entrance to Kindergarten or First Grade for the 2018-2019 School Year

Colorado House Bill 08-1021, Early Kindergarten and First Grade for Gifted Children, extend the definition of "gifted child" to include four year olds who may be able to access Kindergarten and five year olds who can access First Grade, and adds a new classification of "highly advanced gifted child." Essentially, Early Access applies to children in the 97th percentile or above on standardized tests and functioning levels typically two years or more above peers.

For early entrance to kindergarten, a child must be 4 years old by October 1, 2018 and for early entrance to first grade, a child must be 5 years old by October 1, 2018.

How to apply (the cost is \$250):

- 1. Fill out the online application, which will open in January 2018 through sometime in March 2018.
- 2. Once the application is submitted, you will receive, in the mail, an Early Access Packet (with portfolio requirements) and Developmental History

Form from the GT Office.

- 3. The Early Access Packet, Developmental History Form, and portfolio submissions will be due in March 2018.
- 4. Parents will be contacted to schedule Cognitive Testing (DAS-II Differential Ability Scales). Testing is typically scheduled in late March or early

April and takes approximately 2 hours.

- 5. If the child scores in the 98th percentile or higher on DAS-II, a second session will be scheduled to take TEMA-3 (Test of Early Math Ability), TERA-3
- (Test of Early Reading Ability), and an observable play opportunity. This testing will be scheduled in early April 2018 and takes approximately 2 hours.
- 6. Notification of acceptance and non-acceptance is typically sent to parents late in April.

Part of the Early Access process is submitting a portfolio of evidence. This may include examples of art work, writing, photos or videos of things that have been built or auditions. It may be documentation of connections the child has made. It may be statements from preschool teachers. Any way you can show what were 'wow' moments for you. Things you noticed that seem advanced for a child of their age at the time.

If accepted, Jeffco has four elementary schools offering Early Access: Coronado, Hackberry Hill, Kendrick Lakes, and Parmalee. GT Early Access follows the Choice Enrollment process. Transportation is not provided to Early Access locations and is the responsibility of the parent. Jeffco web page for Early Access.

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# Center for Bright Kids Western Academic Talent Search (WATS) - PSAT 8/9, SAT, ACT Testing for Gifted Students in Grades 3-9

The Center for Bright Kids (CBK) is the regional talent center in the Rocky Mountain area, serving 7 states, providing summer programs and other youth programs. The goal of CBK is to "offer K-12 enrichment and acceleration programming for high interest and high ability kids. Our focus is not only on how kids think and learn, but how they discover ways to navigate the world while thinking and learning differently. CBK is focused on providing safe spaces for kids to laugh and play while being intellectually challenged with intensive academic experiences and actively engaged in meaningful, authentic learning experiences."

In addition to their youth programs, CBK also offers testing without ceilings, provided by the Western Academic Talent Search (WATS). The benefit of this testing is to find a child's true potential in Reading, English, Math, and Science at the given time they take the test. Typical assessments used by school districts only test one or two grades up, not demonstrating some childrens' true potential in a subject. WATS testing goes far beyond one or two grades. WATS uses ACT, SAT, and PSAT 8/9 tests. PSAT 8/9 is used for grades 3-6, while ACT and SAT are used for grades 6-9.

Testing is currently being offered. If your child has an ALP (Advanced Learning Plan) in Jeffco, you should have received a letter from the district allowing your child to test. Your child can qualify to test in other ways too if you are interested. If you allow results to be reported to your school district, at least in Jeffco, they will become part of your child's ALP, further aiding your child's teachers in challenging him or her academically.

#### Colorado News - Federal changes for Gifted and Talented

Many of you are familiar with NCLB (No Child Left Behind), a Bush era mandate that required schools to monitor and be accountable to their lowest performing students. While it was a much needed mandate and had some good results, an unfortunate outcome was that our gifted children were left behind. NCLB is now being replaced by ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act), launched during the Obama administration. ESSA allows for states to have more control over their "accountability systems" than allowed by NCLB. ESSA also encourages states and school districts to be accountable to ALL students, expanding the categories of students to include not only our Free and Reduced Lunch population, minorities, migrants, and English Language Learners, but also our Gifted and Talented students. This is a first move to monitor and begin accountability toward our GT students, assuring that all students grow. Is there more to do for GT and ESSA? Absolutely. But, Colorado was one of only a few states given an A+ for their ESSA plan. CDE listened to GT parents and the GT community to ensure GT was incorporated into Colorado's ESSA plan. Thanks to CDE and their work for our kids!

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#### Colorado Student Leaders Institute (COSLI) Summer Program

Colorado Student Leaders Institute (COSLI) is a state-legislated, summer residential program on the University of Colorado Denver campus. For one month each summer, Colorado's best and brightest students, chosen from a competitive pool of applicants, live and study on the campus and earn three hours of college credit. Students choose one of two majors: International Social Studies or STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, & Math), and explore diverse topics through a lecture series by university professors and 3 hands-on projects--Colorado Social Problem Lab, Short-Term Business Lab, and National History Day.

COSLI students do not have to be formally designated as gifted and talented students, but they must demonstrate through their application that they meet the academic rigors that the program requires. At least 50% of our students must be eligible for free and reduced lunch and/or be first generation college students.

COSLI prepares students for college by fostering leadership, independence, innovativeness, initiative, critical thinking, and creativity.
