Round 2 for the 2021-22 school year opens Jan. 19

Choice offers will go out in late January

New Jeffco PK-12 Students:

- Use the <u>School Finder button</u> to find your neighborhood school and/or other school options.
- Contact the school you are interested in attending to enroll.

Current Jeffco K-12 Students:

• If you wish to change schools during the school year, you will need to submit an <u>administrative transfer request</u> to your current school's principal. Unless your family has recently moved, no administrative transfer is needed in this case.

School Information Nights

Deciding which schools to attend next year? Information nights are virtual this year. Check your local school websites for info and dates. Events are generally scheduled for November through January.

Early Access for 4&5-Year-Olds - Application Opens Jan. 4

Early Access applies to children in the 97th percentile or above on standardized tests and functioning levels typically two years or more above peers. Colorado House Bill 08-1021, Early Kindergarten and First Grade for Gifted Children, extends the definition of "gifted child" to include four-year-olds who may be able to access kindergarten and five-year-olds who can access first grade, and adds a new classification of "highly advanced gifted child." The 2021 application will open Jan. 4.

Part of the Early Access process is submitting a portfolio of evidence. This may include examples of art work, writings, photos or videos of things that have been built or auditions. It may be documentation of connections the child has made. It may be statements from preschool teachers. Any way you can show what were "wow" moments for you such as examples that seem advanced for a child of their age at the time.

JeffCon IT Conference for High School Students - Jan. 29

This conference at the Jeffco Ed Center is designed to inform, engage and provide growth opportunities for any Jeffco High School student interested in pursuing a career in the field of information technology (IT). Students must apply through their high school.



<u>Colorado Student Leaders Institute Summer Program - Apply</u> by Jan. 31

The Colorado Student Leaders Institute is an affiliate of the National Conference of Governor's Schools. A Governor's School on a resume is equivalent to a 5 on an AP exam. Students live and study on the University of Colorado Denver Campus for the duration of the program. Students have the choice of two 3-week sessions:

- Session 1: June 20 through July 10
- Session 2: July 11 through July 31

Students can choose from three majors: STEM, Art or International Social Studies and receive interdisciplinary instruction from professors, business leaders, nonprofit managers, local government officials and entrepreneurs. They also complete three labs: entrepreneurship lab, social problem lab,

and National History Day. Application decisions will be announced in early March 2021.

Young Scholars Program - Application open Jan. 11-March 22

The Jack Kent Cooke Foundation's Young Scholars Program opens on Jan. 11. The Young Scholars Program is a selective five-year, pre-college scholarship for high-performing 7th grade students with financial need. It provides academic advising, along with financial support for school, summer programs, internships, and other learning enrichment opportunities. Eligible applicants should:

- Be entering 8th grade in the fall of 2021.
- Have earned all As and Bs since the beginning of 6th grade.
- Reside in the U.S. and plan to attend high school in the U.S.
- Demonstrate financial need with a maximum adjusted gross income of \$95,000.



Jeffco Writing Challenge - Deadline Feb. 22

The Jeffco Writing Challenge is open to all Jefferson County School students in K-12. Poetry, short stories, nonfiction or dramas are all welcome. Winning entries receive cash and gift card prizes, and schools win awards based on student entries.
