"Twice-exceptional students are difficult to identify and support because they possess the characteristics of gifted students and the characteristics of students with disabilities. Gifted characteristics may mask disabilities, or disabilities may mask gifted potential; either students' strengths, disabilities, or both may not be identified. This difficulty in identifying and supporting twice-exceptional students can put them at risk of having their academic or social-emotional needs misunderstood or go unnoticed." Are you looking for more connections and to find other parents who "get it"? Is your child in the Gifted and Talented program and identified as Twice Exceptional (2e)? Me too! My name is Allison Jussel and I am a Jeffco parent of 3 kids, one of which is on the Autism Spectrum.

Our family has been on the Autism journey for almost 8 years now. We have experienced several years of therapy, social skills groups, conferences, and events. We have participated in everything we can to provide the best tools for our son. However, through all of this, I have been missing something important; a community of families who have a child or family member with Autism <u>within</u> Jeffco Public Schools.

While I have built important relationships with families whose kids are in other school districts, and our connection has been a vital support, there are differences between how our school districts handle referrals. I believe building connections within the Jeffco community would help with finding local resources, connecting through school experiences, event recommendations, specialist referrals, and so much more.
