MAP Assessments - Hopefully you received your child's MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) assessment scores at the parent teacher conferences in October. Parents may have gotten varied detail on their child's MAP scores. Depending on your child's grade, different MAP tests were given. To help you understand the assessment:

Jeffco GT - Center School Spring Testing - Application Closes January 16th - Last Chance to Test This School Year

Jeffco Gifted Center applications for spring testing for GT Center placement at a GT Center school or an Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) at the neighborhood/home school will be open October 16, 2017 through January 16, 2018 at 4pm. Jeffco offers free testing for applicants who are 5 years of age (or older) by October 1, 2017 and in kindergarten. These children are eligible to apply for the start of the 2018-19 school year. Jeffco Early Access Testing for Entrance to Kindergarten or First Grade for the 2018-2019 School Year

Colorado House Bill 08-1021, Early Kindergarten and First Grade for Gifted Children, extend the definition of "gifted child" to include four year olds who may be able to access Kindergarten and five year olds who can access First Grade, and adds a new classification of "highly advanced gifted child." Essentially, Early Access applies to children in the 97th percentile or above on standardized tests and functioning levels typically two years or more above peers.

For early entrance to kindergarten, a child must be 4 years old by October 1, 2018 and for early entrance to first grade, a child must be 5 years old by October 1, 2018. How to apply (the cost is \$250):

- 1. Fill out the online application, which is open now through April 1, 2018
- 2. Once the application is submitted, you will receive an Early Access Packet (with portfolio requirements) and Developmental History Form from the GT Office.
- 3. The Early Access Packet, Developmental History Form, and portfolio submissions will be due by March 23, 2018.
- 4. Parents will be contacted to schedule Cognitive Testing (DAS-II Differential Ability Scales). Testing is typically scheduled in late March or early April and takes approximately 2 hours.
- 5. If the child scores in the 97th percentile or higher on DAS-II, a second session will be scheduled to take TEMA-3 (Test of Early Math Ability), TERA-3 (Test of Early Reading Ability), and an observable play opportunity. This testing will be scheduled in early April 2018 and takes approximately 2 hours.
- 6. Notification of acceptance and non-acceptance is typically sent to parents late in April.

Part of the Early Access process is submitting a portfolio of evidence. This may include examples of art work, writing, photos or videos of things that have been built or auditions. It may be documentation of connections the child has made. It may be statements from preschool teachers. Any way you can show what were 'wow' moments for you. Things you noticed that seem advanced for a child of their age at the time.

If accepted, Jeffco has four elementary schools offering Early Access: Coronado, Hackberry Hill, Kendrick Lakes, and Parmalee. GT Early Access follows the Choice Enrollment process. Transportation is not provided to Early Access locations and is the responsibility of the parent. Jeffco web page for Early Access.

Davidson Institute for Talent Development 2018 Davidson Fellows \$50,000, \$25,000 and \$10,000 Scholarships

The Davidson Institute for Talent Development offers high-achieving young people across the country the opportunity to be named a 2018 Davidson Fellow, an honor accompanied by a \$50,000, \$25,000 or \$10,000 scholarship in recognition of a significant piece of work in Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics, Music, Literature, Philosophy or Outside the Box. Applicants must submit an original piece of work that is recognized as significant by experts in the field and that has the potential to make a positive contribution to society. Colorado Student Leaders Institute (COSLI) Summer Program

Colorado Student Leaders Institute (COSLI) is a state-legislated, summer residential program on the University of Colorado Denver campus. For one month each summer, Colorado's best and brightest students, chosen from a competitive pool of applicants, live and study on the campus and earn three hours of college credit. Students choose one of two majors: International Social Studies or STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, & Math), and explore diverse topics through a lecture series by university professors and 3 hands-on projects--Colorado Social Problem Lab, Short-Term Business Lab, and National History Day. COSLI students do not have to be formally designated as gifted and talented students, but they must demonstrate through their application that they meet the academic rigors that the program requires. At least 50% of our students must be eligible for free and reduced lunch and/or be first generation college students.

COSLI prepares students for college by fostering leadership, independence, innovativeness, initiative, critical thinking, and creativity.
