Apply Now for Jeffco Early Access for Entrance to Kindergarten or First Grade

The 2020-2021 Early Access application is now open. Portfolios are due March 19 and the application closes April 1. Early Access applies to children in the 97th percentile or above on standardized tests and functioning levels typically two years or more above peers. Early Access age requirements:

- The student must reach the age of four by October 1 for kindergarten.
- The student must reach the age of five by October 1 for grade one.

<u>Center for Bright Kids Western Academic Talent Search (WATS) Testing for Gifted</u> <u>Students in Grades 3-9</u>

The <u>Center for Bright Kids</u> (CBK) is the regional talent center in the Rocky Mountain area, serving seven states, provides summer and other youth programs. Testing runs from October-February. If your child has an Advanced Learning Plan (ALP), you will need to contact the Jeffco Gifted & Talented Department to receive the Jeffco GT Eligibility letter for WATS testing. Once they verify a student's GT status, they will send the letter to you electronically. In addition to their youth programs, CBK also offers testing without ceilings, provided by the Western Academic Talent Search (WATS). The benefit of this testing is to find a child's true potential in reading, English, math, and science at the given time they take the test.

JeffCon IT Conference for High School Students - Jan. 31

This conference at the Jeffco Ed Center is designed to inform, engage, and provide growth opportunities for any Jeffco High School student interested in pursuing a career in the field of information Technology (IT). Students must apply through their high school.

Colorado Student Leaders Institute - Deadline Jan. 31

Colorado Student Leaders Institute (COSLI) is a state-legislated, summer residential program on the University of Colorado Denver campus. For one month each summer, Colorado's best and brightest students, chosen from a competitive pool of applicants, live and study on campus, and earn three hours of college credit. Students choose one of two majors: International Social Studies or STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, & Math), and explore diverse topics through a lecture series by university professors and 3 hands-on projects--Colorado Social Problem Lab, Short-Term Business Lab, and National History Day.

COSLI students do not have to be formally designated as gifted and talented students, but they must demonstrate through their application that they meet the academic rigors that the program requires. At least 50% of students must be eligible for free and reduced lunch and/or first generation college students.

School of Mines SUMMET 2020 Application - Deadline Feb. 3

The Summer Multicultural Engineering Training (SUMMET) program is an engineering, science and technology program designed for rising juniors and seniors who are from underrepresented populations, including ethnic/racial minority, women and prospective first-generation college students. Only students from Colorado and Oklahoma are eligible to apply to the program. This program is available at no cost to participants, with the exception of a \$50 confirmation fee for students accepted into the program. Program dates are: May 31 - June 12, June 14 - June 26 and July 5 - July 17.

School of Mines Spring Programs for Girls - Sessions begin Feb. 3

DECtech is a Colorado School of Mines outreach program designed especially for girls. Program leaders are female Mines students who are both passionate about their subjects of study and sharing this passion with the next generation. Sessions are offered Monday-Thursday and begin the week of Feb. 3 on the School of Mines campus, 1500 Illinois St., Golden, CO 80401.
