CogAT Parent Seminar - Dec. 8

Advanced Learning Plans: New Process for Grades 6-12

Schools should be wrapping up the Advanced Learning Plan (ALP) goal setting phase soon. GT learners in Jeffco write one academic and one affective goal each year, to help them focus on actualizing their personal potential. This is usually completed by the end of October, but may be somewhat delayed this year.

To make accessing the goals easier for students, teachers, and families, ALP goal setting and monitoring process has moved to a new tool called SOARS for all grade levels (K-12). NAVIANCE will no longer be used for ALPs. For this initial rollout (2020-2021), GT Resource Teachers will be managing the process for your school and students. School staff will be supporting the goals at school.

Center for Bright Kids Western Academic Talent Search (WATS) for Gifted Students Grades 3-9

WATS participants take the SAT, ACT or PSAT 8/9 examinations to evaluate their strengths, gain experience and qualify for recognition and special programming. All participants receive a participation certificate, score interpretation information and access to summer opportunities. High-scoring students testing between October and March are invited to a regional WATS Recognition Ceremony.

If families of GT 3rd-9th graders need verification of GT eligibility, contact the Jeffco GT Dept. at gtinform@jeffco.k12.co.us and they will send a letter indicating your child's gifted identification status. Testing dates: grades 6-9 SAT & ACT, Dec.-June; grades 3-6 PSAT, Jan.-Feb. See the CBK website for testing options this year.

Colorado Student Leaders Institute Summer Program – Apply by Jan. 31

The Colorado Student Leaders Institute is an affiliate of the National Conference of Governor's Schools. A Governor's School on a resume is equivalent to a 5 on an AP exam. Students live and study on the University of Colorado Denver Campus for the duration of the program. Students have the choice of two 3-week sessions:

- Session 1: June 20 through July 10
- Session 2: July 11 through July 31

Students can choose from three majors: STEM, Art, or International Social Studies and receive interdisciplinary instruction from professors, business leaders, nonprofit managers, local government officials, and entrepreneurs. They also complete three labs: entrepreneurship lab, social problem lab, and National History Day. Application decisions will be announced in early March 2021.



Jeffco Writing Challenge - Deadline Feb. 22

The Jeffco Writing Challenge is open to all Jefferson County School students in K-12. Poetry, short stories, nonfiction or dramas are all welcome. Winning entries receive cash and gift card prizes, and schools win awards based on student entries. For more information on the
