



# Gifted & Talented Center Placement and Identification - Applications Due Oct. 15

The fall 2021 <u>GT Center Application</u> is for students testing for the 2022-23 school year for enrollment in one of Jeffco's <u>17 GT Center Schools</u>. For more information on the process, please visit the <u>GT Identification and Assessment website</u>.

Use the <u>Academic ID Referral link</u> if you are looking for GT identification only and not GT Center placement. Use the GT Center application to apply for GT Center.

After your forms are submitted, you will be notified of your child's testing date, either on Oct. 23 or Oct. 30. This is the only testing that will occur during the 2021-2022 school year.
